### Entry and Slip Needs for the Roche Harbor Rendezvous

It's that time of year again to register for the Roche Harbor rendezvous. As your new Rear Commodore, I want to invite all of our members and our Canadian fellow Tolly owners to this year's rendezvous. If you joined us last year, you already know there are many fun events for all ages.

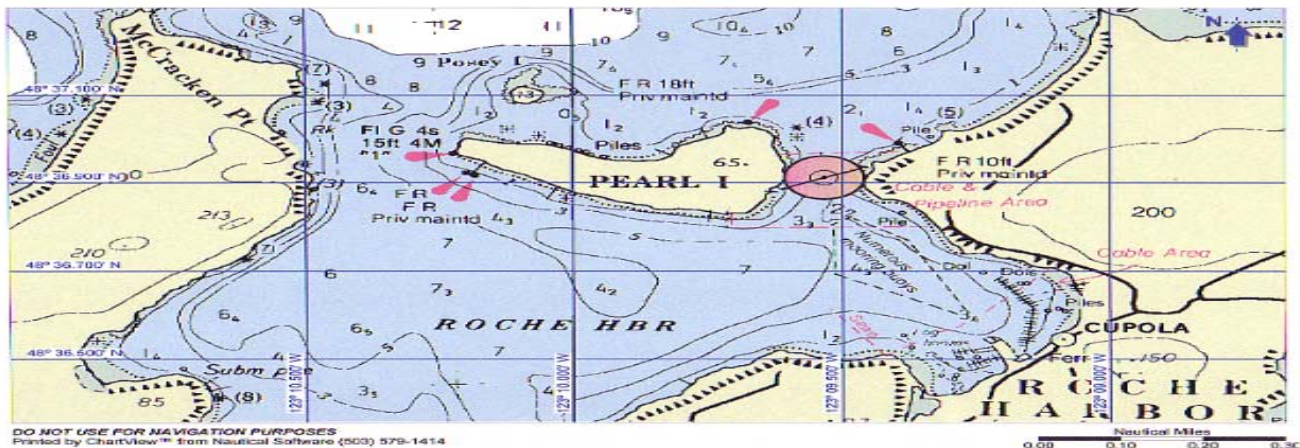
**IMPORTANT INFORMATION:** We want everyone to have a safe entry to Roche Harbor, which can be "eventful" if you don't adhere to the channel markings. The safest entry from the North is through the West channel. Many boaters have found "*the rock*" when entering the East channel. From the South, Mosquito Pass can be safe as well, but be very aware of the correct route through the pass. Stay to the Northeast of the small island midway through the channel. Last year alone, two boats were destroyed and several others severely damaged when they attempted to take "the short cut" through the channel.

## Message From Your Past Commodore Dan Eastlick

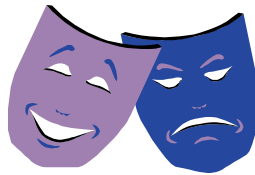
### Bocce, Beads and Thanks

Are ya' ready for some bocce? The first annual Tollycraft International Bocci Tournament will take place at our '04 Rendezvous. Dem Bones (Canada) and E\*Slick (USA) are organizing a friendly couples tournament to be held on the groomed lawns of the Roche Harbor Marina. Now, I have never played bocce, but it looks like fun, and you all know I like a lot of that. Got beads? Did you know that the first recorded instances of tossing souvenirs to the Mardi Gras crowd date back to the 1940s? Paraders, costumed as aristocrats, threw out baubles and sugarcoated almonds. Some think it stems from festival customs in Renaissance Europe, carnivals often involved projectiles (hurled after a village wide ale-and-mead binge.) Legend has it that the first parade participant to use beads was a man dressed up as Santa Claus. The ornamental strands were such a hit that other people picked up on the ritual. It's a fun custom, so bring some beads and share your aristocratic wealth with the huddled masses at this year's rendezvous.

### **Reminder: No Alcohol on Land!**



Roche Harbor Resort has asked us to remind all members that open containers of alcohol are not permitted on land. Open containers are only permitted on the docks or on your boats. At last year's rendezvous, we were allowed to bring alcoholic beverages in the closed areas where the club was directly sponsoring an event. This practice has been discontinued due to legal issues with San Juan County and the state Liquor Board. Roche Harbor Resort and any person violating this ordinance can be held responsible, so we please ask you to refrain from taking alcoholic beverages ashore.

### Book Swap & Swap Meet

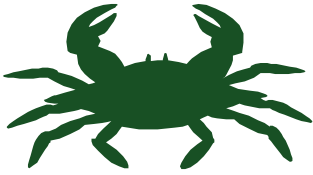
