The Tollyclub is proud to have been invited by the Seattle Yacht Club to enter in the 2005 parade. The parade theme this year is *Sentimental Journey*. All Tollyclub members are invited to participate in our *Sentimental Journey Presentation* of the legendary Tollycraft Boats and capped off with *R.M. You can enter your boat to possibly be one of the parade boats. 2. You can register to possibly be an attendee on one of the parade boats. 3. You can join the "cheering section" by having your boat be one of the Tollycraft boats on the log boom viewing the parade. 4. You can join the Wagon Wheel raft of Tollycraft boats after the parade.

We anticipate 25-30 Tollycraft Boats will be a part of our club entry. Enclosed within this edition of the newsletter is the "Call for Entries" form to enter your boat as a possible participating boat in the parade. There is a "classics" section, which will lead off our parade entry, followed by the 22 Tollys of the "modern" era beginning with the 25' through the 65'

Tollyclub is now accepting entries for your boat to be considered as one of the parade boats in the Boating Season Opening Day Parade on May 7, 2005.

Judging Criteria:

- The primary criteria will be how closely the exterior of your Tolly matches the original production of the boat as depicted in the company sales brochure.
- · Originality will be closely followed by the overall exterior condition of your Tolly.
- · One boat will be chosen for each of the below listed sizes. There are no size criteria for the "classic wooden hull" category. We encourage any member with a wooden hull boat to submit their Tolly for consideration.

- · All judge's decisions are final.
- · All entries must be received by January 31, 2005. Selected entries will be announced in February.

Entry Criteria and Required Exhibits:

- **1.** Owners of selected entries agree to have aboard their vessel as many Tollyclub members as is reasonably safe and appropriate to promote the "Spirit" category.
- 2. Owners agree to participate in the uniform signage and decoration of their boat in accordance with the club "Spirit" entry and to incur the associated costs. The Club is
- seeking sponsorship to help defray expenses and is mindful of keeping costs affordable.
- 3. Owners acknowledge that the Tollycraft Boating Club is NOT responsible for any injury or damage that may occur as a result of participating as a parade entry. Each boat owner assumes full responsibility for the care and safe operation of their vessel.
- 4. Owners agree to attend at least two organizational meetings in March or April. TBD
- 5. All those aboard (above deck) agree to wear the uniform of the day, yet to be determined.
- 6. Submit the following information with your entry.
 - · Owner's Name and Complete Address (inc. City & zip) Boat Name, Model & Length.
 - · Phone #'s (include daytime, evening, and cell # where you can be reached)
 - · Email Address
 - · Identify Category for your submission. Use only the categories shown above.
 - · A brief description of your boat in 50 words or less
 - · Send 2 recent pictures (digital, if at all possible) (1) abeam and (1) from the bow showing the side of your boat.






